REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS

The City of Phoenix is seeking a qualified consultant team to provide engineering services to conduct a condition assessment of the Southern Avenue Interceptor (SAI), a multi-owner regional interceptor governed by the Subregional Operating Group (SROG) cities of Glendale, Mesa, Phoenix, Scottsdale, and Tempe. The SAI ranges in pipe diameters from 48-inches to 90-inches and is approximately 19 miles in length, extending from 48th Street and Southern Avenue to the 91st Avenue Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP).

SECTION I – PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The SAI is constructed of PVC-lined reinforced concrete pipe, with the exception of the twin barrel siphon that traverses across the Salt River at 51st Avenue. The 48-inch and 54-inch twin barrel siphon is constructed of prestressed concrete cylinder pipe (PCCP) that is PVC-lined. A condition assessment was previously completed on this interceptor in 2013. The 2013 report found the interceptor in generally good condition with only six pipe segments identified for repair and approximately 125 manholes were identified for rehabilitation. The recommended rehabilitation was completed in 2017. The twin barrel siphon was excluded from the 2013 report and assessed separately. The siphon assessment was completed in 2018. The barrels and outlet structure were in fair condition and only the siphon inlet structure was recommended for rehabilitation. Rehab of the siphon inlet structure was completed in 2020.

This project will consist of performing a condition assessment of approximately 98,500 linear feet (18.7 miles) of the Southern Avenue Interceptor including the 51st Avenue siphon and approximately 154 associated manholes and structures on the interceptor.

SECTION II – SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work will include, but not be limited to the following:

- Review of past assessments, as-builts, completed rehabilitation and other improvements, and other pertinent documents and records conducive to the assessment.
- Inspect (utilizing remote video inspection equipment) the pipe interior of the interceptor. Prefer that the interior of the pipe be digitally scanned, but high flows and high velocities may prevent this method of inspection.
- Inspect (utilizing remote inspection equipment, such as electro-magnetic scanning equipment to determine wire breaks) the twin barrel prestressed concrete cylinder siphon at 51st Avenue to analyze and determine the structural integrity. If possible, this inspection should be performed without drying up the siphon.
- Inspect (utilizing remote inspection equipment, such as sonar equipment) the twin barrel prestressed concrete cylinder siphon near 51st Avenue and Broadway Road to analyze and determine sediment/debris accumulation.
- Inspect (utilizing video remote inspection equipment) bypass pump “panels” in the crown of the SAI at the locations previously rehabilitated. Panels were cut in upstream pipe segments to accommodate bypass pumps utilized in the rehabilitation project. These panels were structurally restored following pump removal.
- Inspect (utilizing remote video inspection equipment and manned entry) manholes and structures on the interceptor. Standard manholes shall be inspected using digital technology that is capable of scanning the complete interior of the manholes. Manned entry may be necessary for structures/manholes in which digital technology does not provide satisfactory images or for those manholes/structures that need further inspection.
- Standard sanitary sewer cleaning of 39-inch to 90-inch pipe diameters, as feasible and heavy cleaning, as necessary.

- Assess sewer pipe condition using NASSCO PACP and manhole/structure condition using NASSCO MACP (Level 2).
- Test the pipe to soil potentials for each of the twin PCCP barrels at the corrosion monitoring test stations located at the inlet and outlet structures. There are four corrosion monitoring stations, two at the inlet structure and two at the outlet structure.
- Prepare detailed report of observations including a prioritized list of assets for rehabilitation and recommendations for cost effective resolution of discovered defects.
- Develop budgetary costs for high priority defects found in the interceptor, siphon, and manholes/structures.
- Hold progress meetings and workshops as needed to complete the work.
- Prepare a draft report for review.
- Present the recommendations made in the draft report to the SROG Partners.
- Prepare a final report.
- Present the final executive summary to the SROG Partners.

SECTION III - PRE-SUBMITTAL MEETING

A pre-submittal meeting will be held at 11:00 a.m., Phoenix time on Monday, September 19, 2022, at 200 W. Washington Street, City Hall Conference Room 5 West and via WebEx. At this meeting, City staff will discuss the scope of work, general project requirements, and respond to questions from the attendees. It is strongly recommended that interested firms attend the pre-submittal meeting. Inquiries regarding the project scope outside of this pre-submittal meeting must be directed to the Contracts Specialist.

SECTION IV - STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS EVALUATION CRITERIA

A Firm will be selected through a qualifications-based selection process based on the criteria below. Sub-criteria are listed in order of importance in relation to project services. City of Phoenix project experience is not required.

A. Experience of the Prime Firm (maximum 250 points)

Describe the experience and qualifications of the prime firm in providing engineering services for sanitary sewer pipe and manhole condition assessment projects. Identify a maximum of three projects the submitting firm has completed. For each project listed, provide:

1. Description of the project including scope and project owner

2. Role of the firm and explain how this relates to the services being solicited
3. Project's original contract value, final contract value, and reason for variance
4. Project's start date and completion date

B. Experience of the Key Personnel and Subconsultants (maximum 250 points)

Describe the experience and qualifications of the specific project team expected to be assigned to this project in providing engineering services for sanitary sewer pipe and manhole condition assessment projects. For each key person identified, list their length of time with the firm. List each key person's role in the projects provided. If a project selected for a key person is the same as one selected for the firm, provide just the project name and the role of the key person. For each project listed, provide:

1. Description of the project including scope and project owner
2. Role of the team or team member and explain how this relates to the services being solicited
3. Project's original contract value, final contract value, and reason for variance
4. Project's start date and completion date

C. Project Understanding and Approach (maximum 300 points)

Describe your firm's understanding of the City's need for this sewer condition assessment project. Describe the team's approach to the project including project issues such as assessing the siphon, and other important considerations such as scope, schedule and budget.

D. Staffing Information for Key Personnel (maximum 200 points)

Provide the following:

1. Team's availability and commitment to the project, including sub-consultants
2. Team's plan to maintain continuity of the proposed services
3. Organization chart showing key personnel, current professional licenses and/or NASSCO certifications, and assigned roles for the project.
4. Identify the location of the lead firm's principal office and the home office location of key staff on this project.

E. Reference Check (maximum 21 points*)

Use the form provided (Exhibit A) to obtain at least three references. It is preferred no more than one be a City of Phoenix project. If your firm has not completed prior projects with other agencies, you will not be penalized. It is recommended there be references outside the City of Phoenix.

*These points are in addition to the 1,000 points for the SOQ.

SECTION V - SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

New Electronic Submittal Process: Firms interested in this project must submit a Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) electronically through the ProcurePHX online portal.

Submittal requirements are as follows:

- Vendor Information: All firms must be registered in the City's Vendor Management System prior to submitting a proposal. For new firms, the City will send an email to your firm with a vendor number within two business days of submitting the request. The vendor number should be included on the cover of the SOQ. Submittals:

- Submittals must be uploaded to the ProcurePhx website by the submittal due date and time.
- Submit only one SOQ electronically, in .PDF format only, addressing all evaluation criteria. No hard copies will be accepted.
- Clearly display the firm name, vendor number, project title, and project number on the cover of the SOQ.
- A maximum of **10 pages** is permitted to address all content in the SOQ submittal (**Maximum page limit includes evaluation criteria and all additional content. It does not include information sheet.**)
- Submit electronically the Statement of Qualifications by **12:00 noon, Phoenix time, on Friday, September 30, 2022.**
- Upload one complete version of the SOQ addressing all the criteria. Upload format is .PDF.
- Page size must meet requirements of 8½" x 11"
- Font size must not be less than 10 point
- Content count:
 - ✓ Each side of a page containing evaluation criteria and additional content will be counted toward the maximum page limit noted above.
 - ✓ Pages that have project photos, charts and/or graphs will be counted towards the maximum page limit noted above.
 - ✓ Front and back covers, information sheet, Table of Contents pages, and divider (tab) pages **will NOT** be counted toward the maximum page limit noted above, unless they include evaluation criteria and additional content that could be considered by the selection panel.

Information Sheet: Provide an information sheet that includes project title, project number, RFx number, firm name, address, phone number, vendor number, and the name, title, email address and signature of your contact person for the project. Do not include any additional information.

Evaluation Criteria: Address the SOQ evaluation criteria.

Additional Content: Resumes and other information may be included (*content shall be included within the permitted maximum page limit*).

Note: All pages exceeding the specified maximum page limit will be removed from the submittal and not considered in evaluating a submitted SOQ.

SECTION VI – GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION

The following **will be grounds for disqualification**, and will be strictly enforced:

- Failure to submit electronically through the ProcurePHX online portal by the due date and time.
- Violating the "Contact with City Employees" policy contained in this RFQ

SECTION VII - SELECTION PROCESS AND SCHEDULE

Interested firms will submit a SOQ. The firm will be selected through a qualifications-based selection process. A selection panel will evaluate each SOQ per the criteria set forth in Section IV above.

The City will select a firm based on the SOQs received; no formal interviews will be conducted. The City may conduct a due diligence review on the firm receiving the highest evaluation.

The City expects to create a final list of at least three, but not more than five firms for this project. The City will enter into negotiations with the selected firm and execute a contract upon completion of negotiation of fees, contract terms, and City Council approval.

The following tentative schedule has been prepared for this project.

Scope Meeting	November 2022

If the City is unsuccessful in negotiating a contract with the best-qualified firm, the City may then negotiate with the next most qualified firm until a contract is executed, or the City may decide to terminate the selection process. Once a contract is executed with the successful firm, the procurement is complete.

All submitting firms will be notified of selection outcome for this project. The status of a selection on this project will be posted on the City of Phoenix's "Tabulations, Awards, and Recommendations" website:

The selected Consultant should expect to comply with the Arizona State Statutes Title 34 and City of Phoenix Design and Construction Procurement's contract provisions.

SECTION VIII – GENERAL INFORMATION

Citywide Capital Improvement Projects. Consulting and contractor services supporting the City's Capital Improvement Projects are procured under the authority of the City Engineer, currently located within the Street Transportation Department. Design and Construction Procurement coordinates the citywide consulting and construction contracting procurement processes.

Changes to Request for Qualifications. *Any changes to this Request for Qualifications (RFQ) will be in the form of a Notification.* The City of Phoenix shall not be held responsible for any oral instructions. Notifications are available on both the Current Opportunities and ProcurePHX webpage.

It shall be the responsibility of the registered RFQ holder to determine, prior to the submittal of the Statement of Qualifications, if a Notification has been issued. Registered RFQ holders may refer to the web page or call the Contracts Specialist (listed below) to ascertain if a Notification has been issued for this project.

Alternate Format. For more information or a copy of this publication in an alternate format, contact the Contracts Specialist (listed below) - Voice or TTY 711. Requests will only be honored if made within the first week of the advertising period.

Release of Project Information. The City shall provide the release of all public information concerning the project, including selection announcements and contract awards. Those desiring to release information to the public must receive prior written approval from the City.

City Rights. The City of Phoenix reserves the right to reject any or all Statements of Qualifications, to waive any informality or irregularity in any Statement of Qualifications received, and to be the sole judge of the merits of the respective Statements of Qualifications received.

Contact with City Employees. This policy is intended to create a level playing field for all Proposers, assure that contracts are awarded in public, and protect the integrity of the selection process. **OFFERORS THAT VIOLATE THIS POLICY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**

Beginning on the date the RFQ is issued and until the date the contract is awarded or the RFQ withdrawn, all persons or entities that respond to the RFQ, including their authorized employees, agents, representatives, proposed partner(s), subcontractor(s), joint venture(s), member(s), or any of their lobbyists or attorneys (collectively the Proposer), will refrain from any direct or indirect contact with any person (other than the designated Contract Specialist) who may play a part in the selection process, including members of the evaluation panel, the City Manager, Assistant City Manager, Deputy City Managers, Department heads, the Mayor and other members of the Phoenix City Council. As long as the RFQ solicitation is not discussed, Proposers may continue to conduct business with the City and discuss business that is unrelated to this RFQ solicitation with City staff.

Commencing on the date and time a solicitation is published, potential or actual proposers (including their representatives) will only discuss matters associated with the solicitation with the Mayor, any members of City Council, the City Manager, any Deputy City Manager, or any department director directly associated with the solicitation (including in each case their assigned staff, except for the designated procurement officer) at a public meeting, posted under the Arizona Revised Statutes, until the resulting contract(s) are awarded or all offers or responses are rejected and the solicitation is cancelled without any announcement by the procurement officer of the City's intent to reissue the same or a similar solicitation.

Proposers may discuss their proposal or the RFQ solicitation with the Mayor or one or more members of the Phoenix City Council, provided such meetings are scheduled through the Contract Specialist (listed below), conducted in person at 200 W. Washington, Phoenix, Arizona 85003, and are posted as open meetings with the City Clerk at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the scheduled meetings. The City Clerk will be responsible for posting the meetings. The posted notice shall identify the participants and the subject matter, as well as invite the public to participate.

Conflict of Interest. The City reserves the right to disqualify any Proposer on the basis of any real or apparent conflict of interest that is disclosed by the proposal submitted or any other data available to the City. This disqualification is at the sole discretion of the City. Any Proposer submitting a proposal herein waves any right to object now or at any future time, before any body or agency, including but not limited to, the City Council of the City of Phoenix or any court.

Protest Procedures. Firms responding to disqualification or a procurement outcome are referred to the Code of the City of Phoenix Chapter 2, Article XII, Section 2-187 to 2-190.4, which governs protest procedures utilized throughout the selection process.
