All claims are managed through the City's Risk Management Information System (RMIS). No, the third-party administrators (TPAs) are not managing an escrow.
6.	GENERAL: How long has current TPA handled your program?	The current third-party administrators (TPAs) have been working with the City of Phoenix for at least the last ten years. Their services have been limited to liability claim adjustment and vehicle damage appraisal services.
7.	GENERAL: What is current pending of open claims per adjuster?	The City of Phoenix Claims Manager has 200, the two internal Adjusters have over 400, and the current third-party administrators have 225.
