### **JANURARY 30, 2020**

This notification letter shall become part of the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the above referenced projects.

The questions/clarifications asked at the combined Pre-Submittal meeting for both the JOC and CA&I opportunities on January 24, 2020:

- 1. The SBE Goal for the JOC Contractor is confirmed at 5%, as stated in the RFQ.
- 2. Are GIS and Maintenance Reports on-line?
  - a. A portal is being developed and will be provided, no purchase is required. A written schedule will be provided until the portal is ready.
  - b. Background checks are required and will be outlined in the contract and per Job Order Agreement as necessary.
  - c. Schedule to be provided after contract execution and per Job Order Agreement as necessary.
- 3. What is the JOC annual budget?
  - a. Approximately three million.
- 4. Explain the ADEQ grade requirement?
  - ADEQ Grade II certification is required for each Lead personnel of each crew that is onsite.
- 5. How many CA&I contracts will be awarded?
  - a. One CA&I firm will be awarded to support up to three JOC contractors.
- 6. Will bonding statements count towards the maximum page count?
  - a. No
- 7. Will easements or right-of-way issue require an ALTA Survey? If so, who will obtain them?
  - a. The consultant will provide the Legal Description and the City will coordinate permitting.
- 8. Will JOC and/or CA&I contracts require Public Outreach?
  - a. No, City will utilize the City's On-Call contract.
- 9. Will there be a need for Public Involvement in any capacity?
  - a. Possibly when related to a waterline shutdown or construction related activities at the site (ie: landscape, concrete or paving restoration).
- 10. How is the work distributed amongst the JOC contractors?
  - a. The City will attempt to distribute the work evenly; however, it is the City's discretion depending on the City's best interest.

All other terms and conditions remain unchanged.
